

She had been living in a home for several years, but stopped using the litter box when her owner's work shift changed. After trying everything possible and still not being able to resolve the problem, he returned her to the shelter. She was adopted two more times and both times was returned when she stopped using the litter box. The structure and routine of the shelter was perfect for Mrs. Bigglesworth. Everyone that met her fell in love with her. She loved to be held, petted, and brushed and was a striking beauty. Mrs. Bigglesworth served as a greeter at the shelter and usually was one of the first kitties people would see when they came into Cat Welfare. We will miss our sweet girl and thank you to everyone who was a friend to her over the years. Mrs. Bigglesworth has been cremated and her ashes will be buried at the shelter on October 28 around 5:45 p.m. Thank you for loving our special girl.

Cat Condos Make a Big Difference

At Cat Welfare Association, we want to ensure that every cat in our shelter is comfortable and happy during their (hopefully brief) stay with us. Traditional steel cages provide adequate housing, but these cages have a sterile feeling and are often cold, unwelcoming, and can take a toll on a cat's morale while waiting for his/her forever home.

We are hoping to address this concern by switching from traditional cages to cat condos. In addition to being aesthetically pleasing, extra space gives cats more room to stretch and play, sections are available to separate food from litter, and cubby holes allow kitties a chance to have some alone time.

We've already started using these condos in some areas of the shelter. Our "condo cats" have regained some of the confidence and spirit they lost when they were housed in a traditional cage. The change in attitude is incredible!

Cat condos are also very practical:

- Easier to clean. Staff will be able to clean more cages in less time, and the extra hours can be used to socialize our cats and help with other shelter duties.
- **Connectible.** Horizontal pass through allows two or more condos to be connected, providing an opportunity to keep best friends together. This is especially important for cats returned to shelter life after living for years in the same household.
- **Sturdy.** All cat condos are constructed of 3/4" thick moisture-resistant board and covered with thermally fused high-pressure laminates. They're also chip resistant 3 mm PVC protects all door opening and shelf panel edges.
